After hearing a sermon about the virtues of Mother's Day, Dodd approached her pastor and suggested a comparable holiday for fathers. Her pastor agreed and set the date for the third Sunday in June.

It wasn't until 1972 that President Richard Nixon made Father's Day a permanent national holiday by signing it into law.
